Behave in compliance with established global standards and practice and any local code of consumer rights. Respect the uniqueness of an individual with every effort made to provide a holistic and integrated life service consistent with the "norms" of everyday society, respecting the consumer's culture and choices.

Code of Practice - Workability International

The Code requires the provision of competent services to all populations and the recognition of the cultural and linguistic experiences, or life experiences, of both the professional and those they serve. Caution must be taken not to attribute stereotypical characteristics to individuals.

Issues in Ethics: Cultural and Linguistic Competence

The Code of Practice for Social Service Workers sets out clear standards of professional conduct and practice that social service workers must meet in their everyday work. Workers are responsible for making sure they meet the required standards and that nothing they do, or don't do, harms the wellbeing of people who use services.
