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Infant Cpr Guidelines

For infants, use your mouth to make a complete seal over the infant's mouth and nose, then blow in for one second to make the chest clearly rise. Now, deliver two rescue breaths. Begin CPR. If the child or baby is unresponsive to the rescue breaths, begin CPR.

Lastly, perform a head-tilt-chin-lift maneuver to open the infant's airway: the infant [s head should be placed in sniffing position , with the infant's head tilted just enough that the nose appears to be sniffing the air. In this position, the external ear canal should be level with the top of the infant's shoulder.

Two Rescuer CPR for Children (aged 1 year to puberty) When two rescuers are present, performing CPR on a child is the same as performing CPR on an adult, except that the compression ventilation ratio when 2 rescuers are present drops to 15:2. One or two hands may be used to compress the chest to a depth of 1/3 the diameter of the chest.

Call 9-1-1. If no response, call 9-1-1 or send someone else to do so. Make sure the victim is lying on a firm and flat surface facing upwards. 5. Start CPR. If not breathing and unresponsive. Infant CPR isn't hard to do. Follow these steps: Step 1: Verify that the infant is unresponsive and not breathing. Shout to get the infant's attention, using her name. If she doesn't respond, tap the bottom of her foot and shout again while checking for normal breathing. (Look to see whether her chest is rising, and listen for breathing sounds.)

When the need for resuscitation is not anticipated, delays in assisting a newborn who is not breathing may increase the risk of death. 1, 5, 13 Therefore, every birth should be attended by at least 1 person whose primary responsibility is the newborn and who is trained to begin PPV without delay, 2-4.

The AHA guidelines "strongly recommend" that untrained / lay responders perform "compression-only" CPR, sometimes known as CCR. However, medical professionals and trained lay people are still urged to give the victim two "rescue breaths" in between each series of 30 chest compressions. All the changes apply only to adult victims who collapse of cardiac arrest; artificial respiration is still recommended for children and for adults in a few cases, including near-drowning and drug overdose.

Red Cross CPR Steps. 1. Push hard, push fast. Place your hands, one on top of the other, in the middle of the chest. Use your body weight to help you administer compressions that are at least 2 inches deep and delivered at a rate of at least 100 compressions per minute. 2.
