Proper documentation serves many purposes for patients, physicians, nurses and other care providers, and families. Thorough, accurate documentation is important for communication and continuity of care -everyone involved in the delivery of care requires information about the patient.

Nursing documentation, such as patient care documents, assessments of processes, and outcome measures across organizational settings, serve to monitor performance of health care practitioners' and the health care facility's compliance with standards governing the profession and provision of health care.Such documentation is used to determine what credentials will be granted to health care practitioners within the organization.

ANA's Principles for Nursing Documentation

Although it helps establish consistent documentation practices, it's still up to you to properly document your nursing assessments and patient care. Take care to follow these guidelines to prevent a plaintiff's attorney from raising questions about the quality of care you gave your patient. Be objective. Perform assessments using your senses of touch, sight, hearing, and smell, and document facts, not your subjective opinions.
