Assessment and Diagnosis of Posttraumatic Stress Disorder

The PDS-5 begins with two trauma screen questions to assess trauma history and identify an index trauma. An item for each of the 20 DSM-5 PTSD symptoms is included, and an additional four items ask about distress and interference caused by PTSD symptoms as well as onset and duration of symptoms.
