Nubian Campaign

A Nubian Queen arose in the Meroe Empire period during 170-15 BC. She ruled without a king. Her name, Shanakdakheto, is inscribed on ancient Egyptian monuments. One such monument, now in the Cairo Museum, depicts her as the Queen of Kush. Another monument in her honor is a pyramid at Meroe.

The Nubian monuments from Abu Simbel to Philae is a UNESCO World Heritage Site and consists of 11 sites located between these two temples. Only 2 of these 11 sites have remained in their original location: the granite Quarries in Aswan and the fortress of Qasr Ibrim.
